1.	General.	All	To make sure individuals who are advised to stay at home under existing government guidance do not physically come to site. This includes individuals who have symptoms of COVID-19 as well as those who live with or had contact with someone who has symptoms.				
2..	Car Parking & Rigging Area	Social Distancing. Parking and movement around Site.	Cars to be parked "nose to Tail" parallel to the farm track, leaving sufficient room to rig at the rear of your vehicle. Members to rig and take refreshments in the area at the rear of their vehicle When sailing use a one way system along the bank, maintaining a 2 metre distance at all times from any other member.	Grass cut to form two walking areas for a one way system. Cars parked so that rigging takes place near track.	Grass cutting by work party. Social distancing by all members	When government restrictions allow a gathering of more than two people.	

3.	Racing Area	High traffic areas, walkways & Jetties.	When sailing use a one way system along the bank, maintaining a 2 metre distance at all times from any other member. One person on the jetty at a time to maintain social distancing. Access to the jetty should be along farm track. Care should be made on vehicle movement.	Grass has been cut to form two walking areas for a one way system.			
4..	Common Areas	Transmission, Spread of Covid from surfaces	Duty member of the day to spray all handles, handrails etc. Spray to be left near handrails for regular use during the sailing period. Hand sanitizer to be available on table near club.		Duty member		
5..	Toilet Area	Social Distancing, Transmission, Spread of Covid from surfaces	Antibacterial spray to be left outside toilet. Handles and toilet area to be sprayed before and after use. Setting clear use and cleaning guidance for toilets to ensure they are kept clean and social distancing is achieved as much as possible.	Access to the toilet should be along farm track. Care should be made on vehicle movement.			
6..	Accidents and other incidents	Casualty in the case of accident. To prioritise safety during incidents.	Responsible person to retrieve First Aid Kit from Club. If person to person contact is required Protective equipment must be used which will be left with the First Aid Box.	People involved in the provision of assistance to others should pay particular attention to sanitation measures immediately afterwards including washing hands.	Responsible person		

7.	Safety Boat	Transmission, Spread of Covid from surfaces. Risk injuries or back pain or pain elsewhere from handling heavy and/or bulky objects.	In the event the safety boat has to be used, it should be launched and retrieved by three members. One experienced person to man it. If social distancing isn't possible. a face covering can be very simple and may be worn, cover your mouth and nose.	Antibacterial spray to be used on surfaces after use. People involved in the provision of assistance, should immediately afterwards sanitize washing hands.			
8.	Visitors	Social Distancing	Where visitors are on site, site guidance on social distancing and hygiene should be explained to visitors on or before arrival.	Limiting the number of visitors at any one time. Maintaining a record of all visitors, if this is practical.
